Every 4th Monday of the month, except for December this local holds a membership meeting. Normally meetings are attended only by a few diehard brothers and sisters. Often described at the water cooler as a waste of time and that 'I don't go anymore because everyone complains.' Although a verbal scrimmage is often the case it is only because those involved know the importance of attending and participating. The union hall and its monthly membership meeting is a true testament to **Democracy in Action.**

CUPE Local 5167 has a total of 15 officers looking out for the best interest of its combined 3,850 members. Not an easy task. These elected officers represent members in grievances, review local by-laws, assist stewards well as as make recommendations on the overall

functions of the local, among other things. Easy to blame these 15 officers for everything that's wrong, right? Well maybe not so much. This past election for officers under a thousand members turned out to vote, that's roughly 25% of our membership.

What is а membership meeting and what's the point of going? A membership meeting is a monthly meeting open to all members to attend where various items are discussed and voted upon. Items include donations, correspondence of information from the Ontario Federation of Labour (OFL), local updates, CUPE Ontario, labour updates, Conference attendance, etc.

Those grievance's you and your co-workers have filed that may need to go to arbitration. They are voted on at a membership meeting. How the local uses its total revenue of just under \$3 million is reviewed and voted on. Toward the end of the meeting 'New Business' arises. This is the point in time where **you the member have the ability to raise new ideas** and help shape the face of the local. All these tasks are democratically decided upon by you, the member.

Those 15 officers, that only 25% of us voted on merely have the ability to use their position to persuade and guide the remainder of the membership on the best course of action. **The course taken is ultimately**

decided upon by you the member! That's lot of а responsibility, wouldn't you say? Interesting fact, last November the attendance sheet for the membership meeting shows that 24 members attended. That equals 0.62% of our members making 100% of the decisions.

You are the local! You have a stake in the operations! Speak up! Vote! When you attend a membership meeting and participate it is often the case that the results of the items voted on are almost always put into place immediately. So come down and engage your local, you will feel empowered! You will see democracy work. The system is here for you to participate in. Still a little worried? I understand, you can bring a co-worker along with you we don't mind!

You're involvement matters, so this local looks forward to seeing you every fourth Monday of the month at 6pm. Let's move forward together in solidarity.

Support Workers





April 28 the Day of Mourning

History was made, as **Canada became the first country in the world to recognize April 28th as The Day of Mourning**. In 1984 the CUPE National President Jeff Rose announced at the CUPE National Health and Safety Conference in Vancouver, the establishment of the Day of Mourning for workers who had been killed or injured on the job.

On April 28, 1914, the province of Ontario passed the first Workers' Compensation Legislation in Canada, so this naturally became the date for the Day of Mourning.

Today there are over 13,000 Day of Mourning activities held in over 130 countries around the world with over 14 million people participating. There are over **2.2 million workers in the world who die every year** due to work related accidents and 160 million more who become ill due to unsafe work. The governments of Argentina, Belgium, Bermuda, Brazil, Dominican Republic, Greece, Luxembourg, Panama, Peru, Poland, Portugal, Spain, Taiwan, Ukraine, United States and United Kingdom are some of the countries that participate. In addition, the Andean Community of countries has also adopted April 28, thus bringing into scope Bolivia, Colombia, Ecuador and its associate member Venezuela, **bringing the total number to 25 supporting governments that have followed Canada's lead.**

Unfortunately CUPE Local 5167 has also had workers killed on the job. **Bill Morden** was picking up garbage on Valentine's Day, when a woman rushing home to prepare a meal for her boyfriend slammed her pickup truck into the back of a garbage truck, pinning Bill between the two vehicles. Bills heart stopped three times before he finally succumbed to his injuries. **Paul Faustini** fell off the back of his asphalt truck while backing up on a work site. He was crushed and died as a result of his injuries. **Mike Conneley** suffered from exposure to toluene - later he had his leg amputated and after a while died of his injuries. And sadly while working at home **Joe Macaluso** fell 10 ft and landed on his head while hooking up water pipes to house. Many other members suffered serious injuries as a result of unsafe work. A number of them never regained their health and never worked again.

So next month, on April 28 at 11 am take moment and reflect on the meaning of the day. Let's mourn for the dead and fight for the living!





CUPE National Updates


Support the Canadian Labour Congress's proposal to double **Canada Pension Plan** (CPP) benefits to ensure a better minimum pension for all Canadians. The CPP replacement rate would double from 25 per cent to 50 per cent, which would push maximum payments to \$24,000 per year and average payments to \$12,600 per year.

Union Busting Bills brought about by the Conservatives: Bill C 377 is intended to amend the Income Tax Act to require that labour organizations provide financial information to the Minister for public disclosure. The Bill is still with Senate as of November 25, 2014. Bill **C 575** was passed and is now law. This bill makes it easier to decertify unions and harder for people to unionize.
